FINDS IN THE DOCK .- A number of finds of more or less value have been made during the excavation of the dock at the chisels. wharf. Hammers, Ecnuca wrenches, and other tools have been com. mon, but a sensational find was that of a six-chambored revolver. The weapon, which was in fair condition, was loaded in every chamber. On Wednesday discovery, which was hailed with delight, was made in the shape of a bottle of brandy, which was unearthed a few yards from the edge of the wharf. The cork and capsule were intact, and on the bottle being opened its contents were found to be of first class quality. The liquor was quickly disposed of and those who shared in it were very well pleased with unexpected refresher. Since then pick and shovel work has been carried on with extreme caution.
